

## Leave a Donation in Your Will

Thank you for choosing to support Walsingham Care.

For many people who are living on a fixed income, are retired, or have growing families, giving in their lifetime can be difficult. Donating through a gift in your Will (known as a legacy) is an alternative, enabling you to say "thank you" with a gift from your estate after your death. It is also a very tax-efficient way of giving, as gifts to Walsingham Care are exempt from Inheritance Tax.

A gift in your Will of any value is a way of giving that is an important part of how we continue our work in helping the elderly in our local community.

You could help us make a real difference to the care available to local retired people living with a disability, long term health problems or a terminal illness, by leaving a legacy to Walsingham Care.

Most Wills are pretty straightforward and any solicitor can advise you on how to either add a Codicil to your Will to include a new gift, or prepare a new one.

There are various ways you can leave a donation to us in your Will:

- A residuary legacy means the charity would receive the residue of your estate once any debts, expenses, specific gifts and taxes have been paid. This is a great way of ensuring your donation increases in value along with your estate.
- A pecuniary legacy refers to a specific sum of money.
- A specific legacy refers to a particular item.

You can also include any other instructions for your funeral in your Will, for example you may wish to request donations to be made to Walsingham Care instead of flowers being sent. You can ask your Executors to carry out these instructions by including them in a new Will or Codicil.
